On December 19 the club celebrated Christmas with a dinner at Crown Sterling and presented the Book of Golden Deeds Award as part of the festivities. The Book of Golden Deeds Award for 2014 was presented to Aubrey Lee Barbour (affectionately known as Chub). Some of the accomplishment that led to this recognition are:

A family man, Aubrey was married in 1962 to Helen Davis; they have five children, ten grandchildren, and two great grandchildren.

In respect of his mother's wishes, Aubrey was in the entertainment industry for many years as a lead singer and group manager. He performed in the Virginia, Maryland, and North Carolina areas with The Twisters, The Rockin' Rhythms, and The Flamingos.

After a successful singing career, Aubrey was employed with the City Parks and Recreation Department, working there for 42 years, until his retirement in 2010. Aubrey has been the President of the Tinbridge Hill Neighborhood Watch since 1991 and the Tinbridge Hill Neighborhood Council since 1993. His involvement with these groups was used to organize numerous anti-violence and anti-drug activities in the neighborhood. As an environmentalist, Aubrey has worked with the youth as part of the Tinbridge Hill Neighborhood Youth Program to keep the neighborhood clean and cultivate three community gardens.

Bush and First Lady Laura Bush recognition for conservation and environmentalism.

Aubrey serves on the Legacy Museum Board, Old City Cemetery Board, Johnson Health Center Board, and the Community Loan Fund Board.
